Early Check-out for Students

Parents, we are asking that if you need to checkout your elementary student early, that you do so by 2:00 p.m. on a regular dismissal day and by 12:45 on an early release day. It can become a safety concern when students are checked out too close to the dismissal time. Please remember that we do not take dismissal changes over the phone. All changes made to your child's normal means of transportation home are required in writing. We would also like to encourage you to make appointments for your child outside of our school hours in order to maximize your child's learning time and minimize classroom disruptions for all students. We thank you for your partnership!

Tardy Policy

Elementary students are expected to be in their seats and ready to learn by 8:00 a.m. If you arrive at 8:00 or later, parents must park and walk their child to the front office, sign them in, and have a tardy slip issued for admittance to class. Parents, please do not park in the fire lane – this is a safety concern. We thank you for making the effort to have your student to class on time each and every day.

Breakfast and Student Arrival

Students arriving prior to 7:30 are to report to our Before Care Program. Students can be dropped off for breakfast beginning at 7:30. Please ensure your child is dropped off in plenty of time to eat a healthy breakfast.

Car Loop

Students can be dropped off at the car loop beginning at 7:30. If your child needs to be dropped off earlier, please check them into our Before Care Program. When driving up to drop off your student, please remain in your car and have your child exit the car on the side of the school.

We are still having a problem with some students being dropped off in the parking lot and crossing the traffic designated for student drop off. We are working hard to get students unloaded and into school for breakfast prior to 8:00 a.m. when instruction begins. When the traffic has to be stopped, this backs up the drop off line. In addition, it is not safe for our students and families. If you are walking your child to the cafeteria door, please park your car at the front end of the parking lot and use the crosswalk. Coach Badrak is there every morning stopping traffic to ensure safety when crossing. Thank you so much for your help with this matter.

Uniform Policy (Grades K-5)

- All students are required to wear full-length solid colored pants, shorts, skirts or skorts. Inappropriately rolling or altering the pants in any way is in direct violation of the dress code. Shorts, skirts and skorts length must be at least mid-thigh.
- Pants, shorts, skirts and skorts that are too big or too tight, as determined by Administration, are not acceptable and will be deemed in violation of the uniform code. Joggers are allowed. Jeans, stretch pants, and athletic wear are not allowed. Students may wear solid color leggings under uniform shorts or skorts.
- Students must wear an approved t-shirt, collared polo shirt, or dress shirt. Student shirts must be a solid color and in accordance with the individual schools' uniform guide below. All shirts must bear the School logo.
- Any attire, including backpacks, displaying gang related paraphernalia or symbols, profanity or any inappropriate logos or displays are strictly prohibited.
- All headgear (hats, scarves, bandanas etc.) are prohibited on school property.
- Shoes must be closed or be strapped in the back. Flip-flops, crocs, slippers, or high heel shoes are prohibited.
- If a student chooses or needs to wear a jacket or sweatshirt due to cold weather, it must be a solid color of blue, black, or grey and in accordance with the individual schools' uniform guide.

Before and After-School Enrichment Programs School Age Before-Care

Before-Care begins at 7:00 am. Students participate in art, a variety of team-based games, and social fun. Every student enjoys a healthy breakfast in the café before the school day commences at 7:30am. Reg-



istration forms are available in the front offices of Odyssey Charter Elementary School and Odyssey Preparatory Academy.

There is a one-time registration

fee of \$25.00 per family. The weekly rate for Before-Care is \$15.00 per week and the daily drop-in rate is \$4.00 per day.

After-Care is available to students until 6:30pm each day, and every student is provided a healthy snack. Students are grouped by grade levels and activities include: Yoga, art projects, nature trails, digital learning, and homework support with a certified Odyssey Teacher. Registration forms are available in the front offices of Odyssey Charter Elementary School and Odyssey Preparatory Academy.

There is a one-time registration fee of \$25.00 per family. The weekly rate for After-Care is \$55.00 per week and the daily drop-in rate is \$12.00 per day. 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Bus Transportation

Odyssey Charter Schools provides bus transportation to students who live between two and four miles from the school – more miles might be allotted as per established bus routes. Bus registration is online this year and computers be available during summer registration. Each student is allowed one designated bus stop. Changes to assigned routes or bus transportation needs will not be permitted until a new registration form is completed by a parent/guardian with proper ID completes a new registration form.

Here is a snapshot of the enhanced Transportation Services for the 2021-2022 school year:

- For the safety of our bus drivers and all students, students are highly encouraged to wear a mask during bus routes
- Any students with an elevated temperature will be seated in the designated area in the front, parents will be contacted, and students will be picked up from the school.
- Siblings will sit together during all routes
- Please be mindful and practice good hygiene and manners.

How to Help Your Student Prepare for Success at School (Or at Home)

We know that children function best when they maintain routines as closely as possible. When we talk about schedules and routines, we aren't just talking about one part of the day, we are talking about the whole day. While children are more successful with routines it is important that they have ownership in the routine. Requiring your child to be an active participant in the routine will help the child and family. Give younger students a picture check-list to help them know what needs to be accomplished in what order. Set alarms for older children. Remember to keep directions simple and clear, especially for younger children. Below are some routines to consider adding to your daily schedules.



Bedtime Routine

Bedtime routines can be an enjoyable time for a family. The key to this, is organization and consistency. Maintaining a routine for bedtime procedures not only helps the student's mind and body prepare for sleep, it also supports a calm, morning transition. Below are some bedtime routine suggestions:

- Place completed homework (or notes to the teacher) in backpack
- Lay-out uniform for next school day (don't forget shoes and socks!)
- Shower, brush teeth
- Pack lunch, snack



Morning Routine

Mornings don't always have to be stressful! Children function best if they main routine as closely as possible. Below are some morning routine suggestions:

- Set alarms for various times in the morning like, when to wake up, eat breakfast, brush teeth and leave for the bus stop
- School starts promptly at 8:00 so alarms are helpful to be on time

i-Ready

Students have been working hard to complete their Beginning of the Year diagnostic assessment. i-Ready is a computerized program to help your student in reading and math instruction.

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Be on the lookout for your student's score report going home with the first report card. It is imperative that all students K-5 complete 45 minutes a week in both Reading and Math. This will help strengthen their skills in both academic areas.



Tutoring

After school tutoring will be beginning soon. Tutoring will be offered for students in grades 2nd-5th. Tutoring will take place on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3:15-4:30. Transportation will not be provided. Be on the lookout for an invitation which will be going home within the next few weeks.
